



Adj Prof Graham E. Holder
Consultant Electrophysiologist

Prof Graham E. Holder is Adjunct Professor at the National University Hospital, Department of Ophthalmology. He began his career in Clinical Neurophysiology before being appointed Consultant and Director of Electrophysiology at Moorfields Eye Hospital in 1995, a position he held for 22 years. In 2017, he moved to Singapore to take up the Hong Leong Professorship. Following its completion in 2025, he continued his association with the Department of Ophthalmology as Adjunct Professor.

Prof Holder's research interests include inherited and inflammatory retinal disease, neuro-ophthalmology, retinal imaging, and structure-function relationships.

Prof Holder has more than 280 peer-reviewed publications with over 30,000 citations, more than 45 book chapters, and three co-edited or co-authored books. He was conferred an Honorary Professorship at the UCL Institute of Ophthalmology in 2007 and at Sydney Medical School in 2013. He served as Director of Education for the International Society for Clinical Electrophysiology of Vision (ISCEV) from 2001 to 2014.

Prof Holder has received several notable awards, including Achievement Awards from both the American Academy of Ophthalmology and the Asia-Pacific Academy of Ophthalmology, the Edridge Green Medal from the Royal College of Ophthalmologists, the Percival J. Hay Medal from the North of England Ophthalmological Society, and the prestigious Donald Gass Medal from The Macula Society. He is a past President of EVER (the European Association for Vision and Eye Research) and the recipient of the Adachi-ISCEV Award (2025).

Prof Holder has lectured extensively worldwide and remains a passionate teacher and researcher committed to improving patient diagnosis and management.
