EMPOWERED LIVING PROGRAMME

In addition to providing clinical HIV care, the MIDC team conducts a 1-day workshop that provides an opportunity for Persons Living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA) to learn about HIV, medication, diet and wellbeing. It also provides an opportunity for you to meet and socialise with other PLWHAs.

WHY START EARLY TREATMENT?

Early treatment should be offered to anyone with a confirmed HIV diagnosis, for the benefit of the patient, and to reduce the risk of HIV transmission in the community.

Providing Same-Day Antiretroviral Therapy (ART) during early HIV infection helps to improve the patient's body immune function to prevent future onset of HIV-related complications. There is evidence that Same-Day ART reduces treatment delays, improves the patient's retention in care and virologic suppression (undetectable status).

With the current standard treatment initiation procedure, patients may wait up to eight weeks before medications can be started. The waiting period before treatment is an anxious one as patients have concerns over costs, side effects and the psychosocial impact that can deter a person from seeking treatment. Same-day ART seeks to reduce this anxiety when treatment starts early.

At MIDC, we offer patients the opportunity to start Same-Day ART during their first visit to our clinic.

WHAT TO EXPECT ON THE FIRST VISIT



Guaranteed appointment in our clinic within 96 hours for newly diagnosed patients.



Immediate holistic assessment by doctor, nurse and medical social worker.



Comprehensive ART counseling by pharmacist.



Eligible patients who qualify for rapid ART will be offered to start treatment on the same day.
