Discharge Instructions for Post Peritoneal Dialysis Catheter Insertion



Khoo Teck Puat - National University Children's Medical Institute

Dear Patient / Caregivers,

This brochure contains discharge instructions on the care required after you/your child has undergone catheter insertion for peritoneal dialysis.

Activities and Sports

- Avoid strenuous activities or exercises that can cause the pulling or tugging of the catheter.
- The doctor or dialysis nurses will keep you updated on when you/your child can resume regular activities.



Nutrition and Diet

- Adhere to a low salt and phosphate diet as advised by the doctor or dietitian.
- Restrict fluid intake to _____ ml per day.

Medication

- You/your child will be required to take a list of medications when on dialysis. It is important to keep an up-to-date list and to play your part in knowing the medications, the dosage and what they are for.
- Always check with the doctor or dialysis nurses before taking other medications.
- Go through the discharge medication with the ward nurse or pharmacist. Clarify with them if you are unsure why the medications are prescribed to you/your child.

Wound and Exit Site Care

- Keep the wound and exit site dressings clean and dry at all times until the next review with the dialysis nurses.
- Do not wet the dressings and do not shower until further instruction is given by the dialysis nurses. Use a damp cloth to wipe the chest and abdomen area.
- Please contact the dialysis nurses immediately if the dressings are wet or soiled by accident.



Catheter Care

- Secure the catheter to the skin of the abdomen at the exit site with tape as taught by the dialysis nurses. This will help prevent it from twisting and being moved or pulled out.
- Avoid scratching and pulling at the catheter.
- · Avoid sleeping on the catheter site.
- · Avoid wearing tight clothing.
- Do not disconnect any tubing, connectors, clamps from the catheter.
 If the catheter becomes disconnected, please contact the dialysis nurses immediately.

Pain Management

 You/your child will be given painkillers for consumption when necessary, upon discharge. However, if the pain is not relieved, please contact the dialysis nurses.

Contact the dialysis nurses immediately if you/your child experiences:

- Increasing abdominal pain
- Foul smelling discharge from the exit site
- Wet or soaked wound or exit site dressing
- A fever of 38°C and above


Special Instructions and Follow Up

- The dialysis nurse will check the dressing on the day of your/your child's discharge or 1 day prior to discharge.
- You or your child will be required to see the dialysis nurse for dressing and catheter flushing on:
- i. Date: _____ at ____ am / pm ii. Date: ____ at ____ am / pm
- You/your child will be admitted for the training of peritoneal dialysis. Training dates will be advised by the dialysis nurses.



Reminders







Do not soak ir the bath tub.



Do not place belt on the exit site or wear tight clothing.



Do not apply powder or ointment on the exit site unless ordered by the doctor.





Do not scratch the exit site.
