








What is Paediatric Outpatient Parenteral Antibiotic Therapy?

Paediatric Outpatient Parenteral Antibiotic Therapy (P.OPAT) is a service that allows your child to continue his or her course of prescribed intravenous (IV) antibiotics treatment at home or in an outpatient setting. IV antibiotics are typically given to children admitted in the hospital, however some are suitable and safe for home or outpatient administration.

P.OPAT is delivered either as a daily infusion which requires short daily visits, or as a continuous home infusion which requires 1 to 2 outpatient hospital visits per week.





Once your child is deemed ready for discharge by the primary doctor, he or she will be referred to the P.OPAT team who will advise on your child's suitability for P.OPAT.

The following factors will be considered, depending on whether:

- Your child is clinically well and stable
- Antibiotic prescribed is suitable for home/outpatient administration
- Your child can be brought in daily or as scheduled

- There is a caregiver who is willing to be trained and is deemed competent to administer the antibiotics at home (applicable to those using home infusers)
- Caregivers are comfortable in taking care of the IV Cannula (for daily infusions) or Peripherally Inserted Central Catheter (PICC) line (for continuous home infusions) at home
- There are adequate finances and/ or insurance/MediSave coverage

The P.OPAT service, although recommended, is not mandatory. You may decide whether the service is suitable for you and your child.



If I choose the P.OPAT service, when will my child be discharged?


Daily Infusions at the Paediatric Day Therapy Centre

Your child can be discharged on the same day or next day, as soon as the necessary counselling and arrangements are completed.

Home Administration via Infusers

2 to 3 days will be required for the preparation of the infusers by the Department of Pharmacy. Depending on the choice of antibiotics, preparation for discharge may take longer than 3 days. The P.OPAT team will advise you on the estimated timeframe.

During this period, caregivers will be provided training by the P.OPAT nurse. It is recommended for at least 2 caregivers to be trained for home administration. The appointed caregivers will be assessed for competency via a handson assessment and checklist prior to discharge.



When do I need to come to the P.OPAT clinic and who will attend to my child?

You will be expected to come in daily or as scheduled depending on the choice of antibiotics and treatment decided by the doctors. The Paediatric Day Therapy nurses will attend to your child during the appointments. Your child will also be reviewed regularly by the P.OPAT team for the duration of the OPAT antibiotics.



What happens if my child feels unwell or if there are concerns when we are at home?

- Contact the P.OPAT helpline if you have concerns or if you notice your child experiencing any of the following symptoms:
 - Fever above 38°C
 - Redness or swelling around the PICC or IV cannula site
 - Leaking or bleeding at the PICC site
 - Blocked PICC line (for those on home administration)
 - Faulty infuser (for those on home administration)
- Bring your child to the Children's Emergency if the PICC line falls out. If the line has fallen out partially, do not attempt to remove the remaining line. If it has fallen out completely, bring it along with you to the Children's Emergency.
