## Fever (38.0°C and above)




- Is above 3 months old
- Has a fever of less than 40°C
- Has a fever for 5 days or less
- Is still active and drinking well
- Has no change in urine output

- Is above 3 months old
- Has a fever of less than
   41°C
- Has prolonged fever for 5 days or more
- Is drinking less but at least half of the usual fluid intake
- Has a decrease in urine output

- Is below 3 months old
- Has a fever of more than
   41°C
- Is feeling lethargic
- Has breathing difficulties
- Has a fit
- Is drinking less than half of the usual fluid intake
- Has no urine output for the past 8 hours

## Gastroenteritis



- Has mild vomiting and/or diarrhoea
- Is drinking as per normal
- Remains active
- Has no change in urine output
- Has persistent vomiting
- Has mild blood-streaked diarrhoea
- Has abdominal pain that comes and goes
- Is drinking less but at least half of the usual fluid intake
- Has a decrease in urine output
- Is slightly more tired than usual but mostly active


- Has severe vomiting with blood and bile-stained fluid
- Has severe bloody diarrhoea
- Has severe abdominal pain
- Is drinking less than half of the usual fluid intake
- Has no urine output for more than 8 hours
- Is lethargic

Upper Respiratory
Tract Infection



- Has fever, mild cough, runny or blocked nose
- Have no breathing difficulties
- Is drinking as per normal
- Remains active
- Has no change in urine output
- Is slightly more breathless than usual
- Has a mild wheeze or noisy breathing
- Is drinking less but at least half of the usual fluid intake
- Has a decrease in urine output
- Is lethargic
- Has breathing difficulties and looks blue
- Is drinking less than half of the usual fluid intake
- Has no urine output for the past 8 hours

## Hand, foot and mouth disease (HFMD)



- Has fever and rash over hands, feet and/or mouth
- Is feeding as per normal or with slightly reduced intake
- Remains active
- Has no change in urine output
- Is drinking less but at least half of the usual fluid intake
- Has a decrease in urine output
- Is less active

- Is lethargic
- Is drinking less than half of the usual fluid intake
- Has no urine output for more than 8 hours
- Has headache
