Clinical Updates from Gastroenterology and Hepatology

The gut harbours a diverse and host-specific microbial community. Whereas host-microbe interactions are based on homeostasis and mutualism, the microbiome also contributes to disease development. In this talk, we will share the recent findings connecting the GI microbiome with GI disease. We will also discuss approaches aiming to restore disturbed microbiome compositions thereby promoting health.

The management of Hepatitis C has been revolutionised with the introduction of highly effective oral therapy. The majority of patients with Hepatitis C should be treated to prevent complications of cirrhosis and liver cancer. Hepatitis B remains the number 1 cause of liver disease in Singapore, and antiviral therapy is advised in certain situations to prevent progression to liver cirrhosis.

In this talk we share updates in the clinical management of Hepatitis B and C.
