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The information in this brochure is meant for educational purposes and should not be used as a substitute for Medical diagnosis or treatment. 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A **breast biopsy** is a minor procedure, which removes tissues from the breast so that it can be tested to determine if the patient has cancer. An accurate biopsy can be taken from most patients without the need for open surgical procedure.

An image-guided biopsy is required when an abnormality is detected on a mammogram and/or ultrasound scan. However, 90% of the biopsies are negative (Health Promotion Board, 2012), i.e. no cancer is found.

What to Expect During the Procedure

There are several types of percutaneous breast procedures available.

- Core Needle Biopsy
- Vacuum Assisted Biopsy

These procedures are done under local anesthesia and as a day-surgery procedure in an outpatient setting.

The area in the breast where the abnormality is noted is first localised using an ultrasound or mammogram machine. The radiologist then inserts a needle to obtain small samples of tissue. Several needle insertions are usually required to obtain an adequate sample.

After The Procedure

- Ensure that you have someone to accompany you home after the procedure.
- You will be given a dressing to cover the puncture site after the procedure. Please keep the dressing dry. The dressing can be removed after 2 days.
- Should there be any bleeding, do compress the wound firmly for 15-20 minutes. If the bleeding persists, please call the following numbers below based on which hospital the procedure was performed at, or see a Doctor/GP at the nearest clinic around your area.

- Should you experience pain over the wound site, you may take Paracetomol or Codeine. Do NOT take Aspirin or Ponstan (mefenamic acid) for the pain.
- Avoid vigorous swinging of the arm on the affected side for 48 hours after the biopsy.

- Please bring along your previous breast imaging (mammogram/ultrasound) films (if any).
- Please inform your doctor or radiographer if there is a possibility that you may be pregnant.
